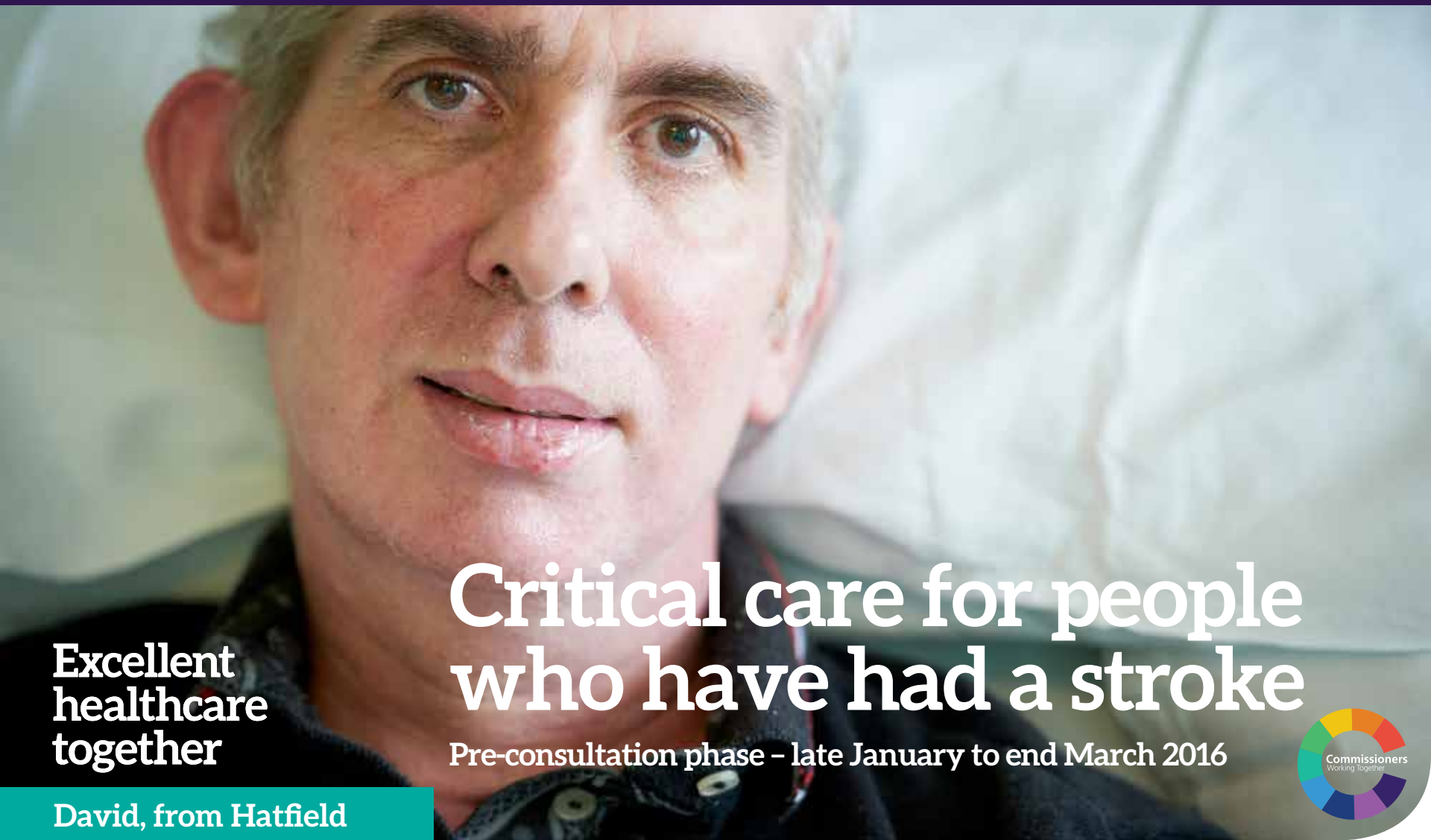

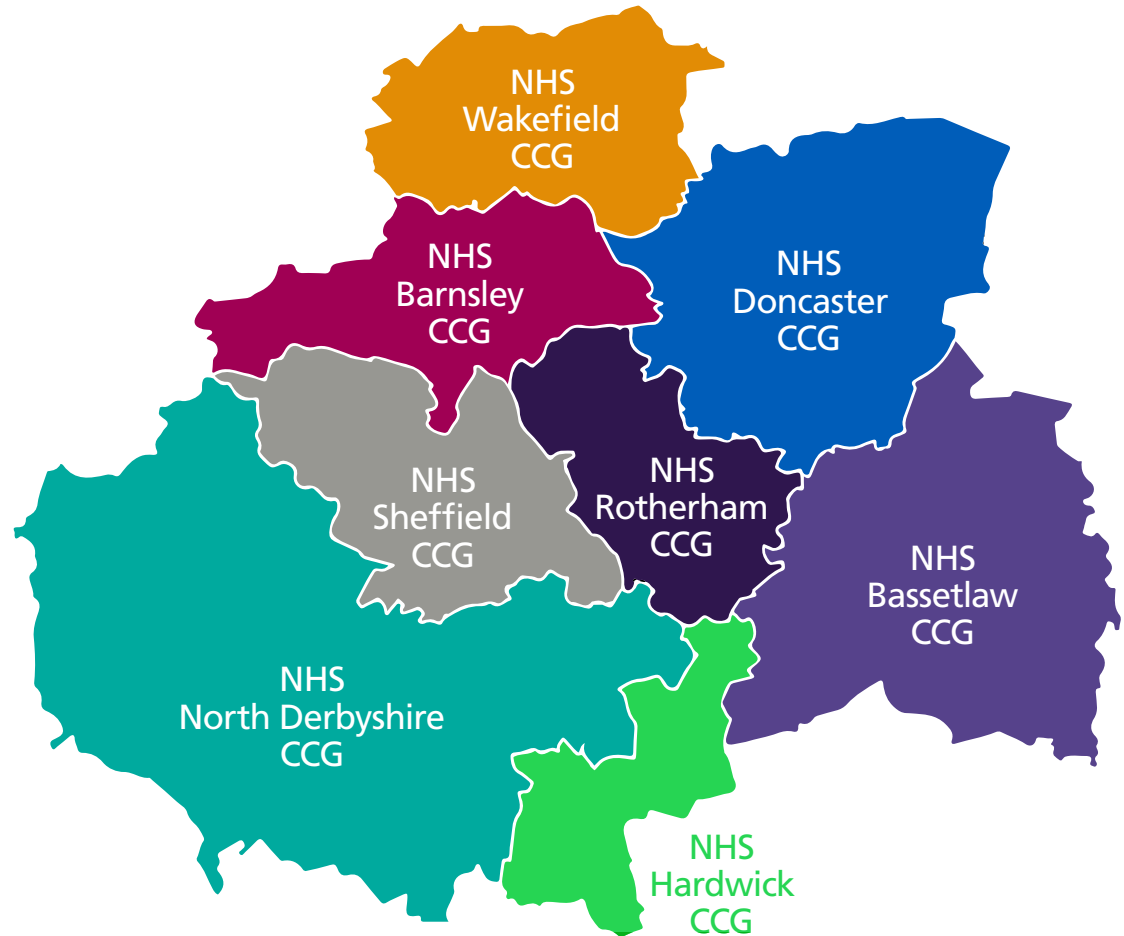


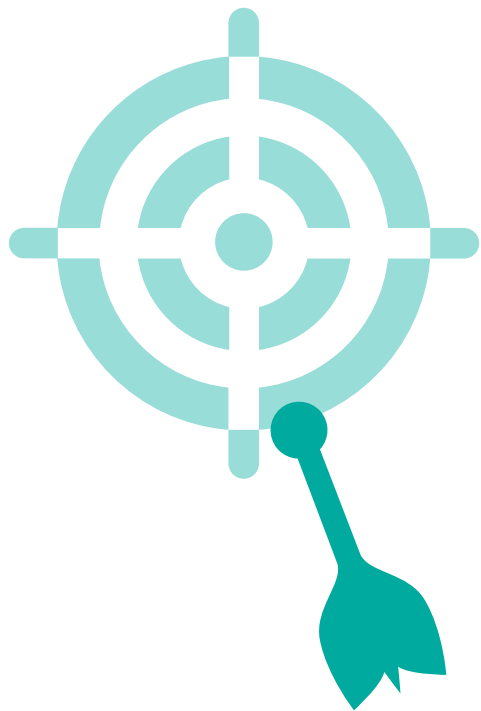

**There are several reasons
for the review of critical
care for people who have
had a stroke, these include:**



**We need more stroke doctors
and nurses to run the services
– but there aren't enough
locally or nationally.**



**Not all stroke patients are
seen by a stroke doctor or
admitted onto a stroke unit
as quickly as they should be.**





There is a shortage of speech and language and occupational therapists who help rehabilitate people who have had a stroke.





**How fast tests are done –
which helps to diagnose
patients – varies from
hospital to hospital.**



The quality of the service isn't the same everywhere – all hospitals must work to high standards but for the reasons above, this is getting harder.





**Doctors, nurses and
healthcare staff all agree
that the way stroke services
is provided needs to change.
This could include how we
provide services locally and
how you access them.**





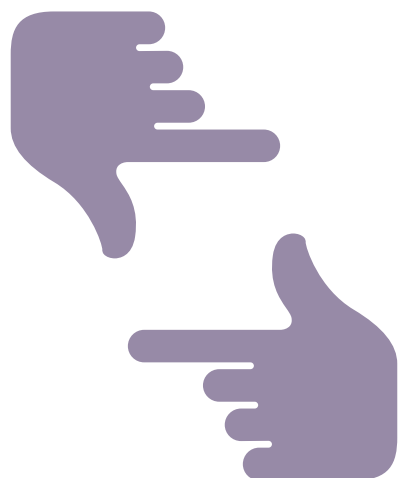
People tell us they want their care to be as close to home as possible and this is what we are trying to do. We want to plan and buy as much of your care as close to you as we can.

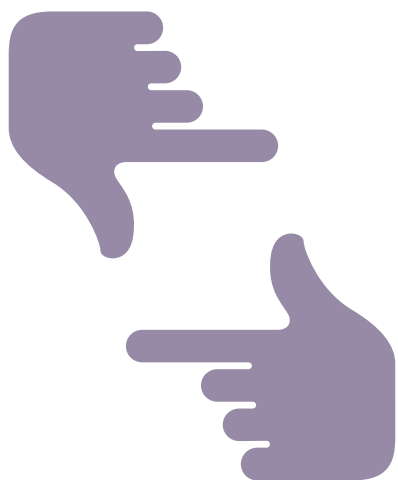

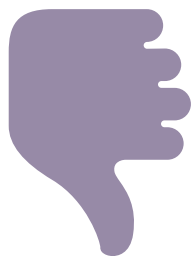


We've explored **three** options:

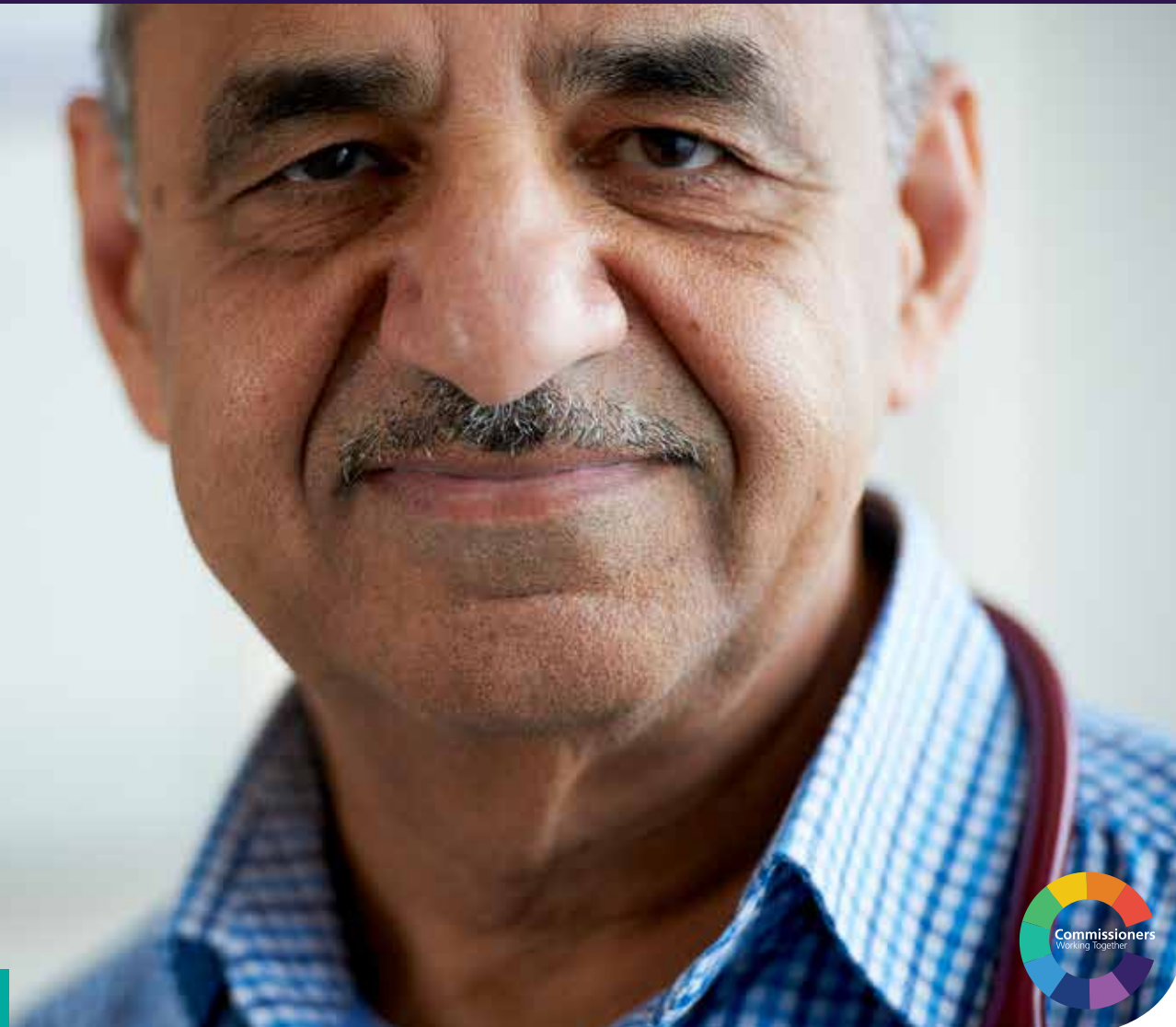
