Who is the CQC?

The CQC inspect health and adult social care services in England.

They make sure health services are good quality and safe.



What are the CQC focus groups for?

The way the CQC inspect services has changed. They want to listen better to the views and experiences of people like you who use services.

One way they do this is to hold small 'focus groups' or meetings.

This involves about 10 people meeting with CQC inspectors to tell their own story of using services.

The inspectors will take notes of what is said but people won't be named in their report.



Who should go to this focus group?

You should attend this group if:

- You have used the Sheffield Teaching Hospital Trust's services - either those at the hospital or community services
- You have used these Trust services in the last 12 months



When and where?

The meeting will take place on Wednesday 2 December 2015.

It will run from 10.30am to 12pm.

It will take place at Love Street in the Red Room.
